A community festival taking science out of the lab and into our everyday lives. The festival is about celebrating curiosity, asking questions and taking a leading role in finding out the answers.



Festival Principles

The Festival of Science and Curiosity is based on the principle that science is inherently creative and has to be part of our cultural lives, not remote, exclusive or only conducted behind closed doors.

The Festival works with local communities, especially in areas of disadvantage or deprivation, so people of all ages and backgrounds can participate, interact and have interesting conversations about the questions they are curious about.

The Festival finds innovative ways to provide young people with that first spark of interest where science, technology, engineering and maths could be part of their future.



Festival Aims & Objectives

Increase engagement of new audiences across Nottinghamshire with science and curiosity through positive experiences.

Change perceptions and improve awareness of how science and curiosity are part of and impact on our everyday lives.

Stimulate and nurture curiosity, creativity and innovation.

Develop a creative, collaborative culture of engagement that facilitates dialogue between scientists, researchers, experts, educators and civil society.





The Festival Format

The Festival takes place over two weeks each February and comprises a programme designed to engage all audiences. The festival comprises:

- A schools programme featuring in-school workshops, off-site visits, virtual meetings with researchers and a science fair
- A festival magazine featuring articles, puzzles and activities written by local researchers and edited and graphic designed by young people
- A programme of of drop-in events and workshops in communities across Nottinghamshire during half-term holiday

The next Festival will take place 10 - 21 February 2025.

2024 Highlights

The Real Science in Schools Symposium - an afternoon at the Nottingham Council House celebrating the science research projects being conducted by pupils in schools across the county, with a morning session for special schools and an afternoon session for mainstream primary schools

Rural Events - a series of workshops in more rural locations in the county through libraries, museums and heritage sites, reaching families who haven't previously engaged with the festival

Magazine - a 40-page magazine featuring articles and activities from local scientists, produced with young graphic design students and distributed across the county through schools, libraries and community organisations

Community Grants - supporting three local organisations to develop and deliver events as part of the festival programme using their knowledge of their audiences to engage them with new scientific topics





Looking to 2025 and beyond

2025 will be our tenth festival and is an opportunity to reflect on and celebrate where we have come from and the progress we have made in reaching our goals over the past ten years.

As we look to the future, we aim to continue to increase the reach and impact the festival has within all our communities across our city and county. Priority areas we are focusing on to achieve this include:

- Maximising equality, diversity and inclusion in everything we do
- Deepening our impact in all of our communities
- Increasing our visibility, profile and reputation across the city and county
- Expanding connectivity between local businesses and their communities
- Ensuring long-term festival sustainability from mixed and diverse sources of funds
